

Membership at M.F.C. means:

A people who profess and give evidence that they have been saved by God's grace alone, for his glory alone, through faith alone in Christ alone and who are committed to Christ and to one another.

A people who profess and by the consistency of their lives demonstrate to the church, and also to the community, that they are a living and active part of M.F.C. as a result they have increased others expectations of them.

A people that have identified themselves with the church and in doing so have let the leaders and other members know that they intend to be committed in attendance at main gatherings, in giving, in prayer, in service and in lifestyle.

A people who have responded in obedience by being baptised in water, or undertake to be at the first opportunity, and who are open and responsive to the Holy Spirit's activity in their life and in the church.

A people who live locally, whose primary church family is M.F.C. they are not members of other churches.

A people who have made a clear distinction in the way they live their lives between being part of the world and being part of God's kingdom.

A people who have identified themselves with the church and in doing so have called for the eldership of the church to lead and oversee them and for the other members to love and care for them as brothers and sisters in Christ.

A people who are in the church not just for the benefits it offers them but as a way of fulfilling God's design for church life and their biblical responsibilities to others.

A people who have entered into a strong and loving bond which is not quickly or thoughtlessly broken, they have committed to grasp hold of one another in mutual love and discipleship and carry a strong sense of personal responsibility for the church family.

A people who share the same basis for their faith which is based on important core doctrines (*as outlined in the core doctrine statement*)

A people who willingly embrace and commit to the purpose, values and vision of the church and work together at seeing them become a living reality (*as outlined in the vision & values statement*)

A people who are identified with a worldwide family of churches. 'Newfrontiers' churches are on a mission together under the leadership of apostolic teams.
